A Letter From The Desk of Pastor John

As we enter into the Paschal season, Easter Sunday is the pinnacle of the Christian year. We are well aware of the long-standing commercialization of the day. We have become conditioned to secure a share of Easter cards, table decorations, new spring clothing, baskets, grasses, egg coloring kits, billowy stuffed bunnies, and candies of sizes, shapes, and calorie counts. Sweet treats of jellybeans, marshmallow chicks, chocolate and caramel eggs, chocolate crosses (Oh my!), and chocolate rabbits line store shelves, each begging to be taken home. Easter baskets are a tradition, and you don't mess with the culture. Habit rhymes with rabbit. Ginny and I know! We have grand-children, too. We have baskets for each of them. As an adult, I have nothing against candy. At tender ages, we had little understanding of the connection between the Cross and Resurrection. The mystery of our faith was transferred into the innocent question: "Can I have another chocolate egg?"

As adults, we have a better understanding of the Resurrection, much more so than the litany we heard as youth: that Jesus died for our sins, was crucified, laid in the tomb, and was resurrected.

Rather, the Resurrection is what writer and pastor Robert Maas tells us is far less about detailing each act of Holy Week. "It is enough to hear the truth, to repeat the stories of the day, and for each listener to discern what they need of the Gospel: the hope of a coming King, the acknowledgement of a prophet in conflict with injustice, and the empathic compassion of a suffering servant."

Our entire Lenten journey culminates with the belief that Love arose from the grave to new life, and that Easter eggs represent new life and rebirth. Whatever your sense of the Resurrection, there is no better story than the one that tells of a humble compassionate and just servant. The resurrected Jesus becomes our resurrection to act justly and with compassion toward others. Suffering and death is the beginning. Life in Christ is our present and our future.

We needn't rely on a chocolate cross to demonstrate the point.
