I know an old woman who worries about outliving her partner and most of her family and friends. The grief of that anticipated loss messes with her sleep. And the fear. Compassionate Christ, open your church's arms to the lonely and fearful, no matter who, no matter why, no matter when.





The following is a recent article on how the United Church of Christ and your donations are helping:




The United Church of Christ is offering prayers for the region encompassing Turkey and Syria as the death toll continues to climb following one of the <u>strongest earthquakes in 100 years</u>. As of Feb. 13, the number of people killed has <u>passed 36,000</u>. Responders who have worked hard in the cold weather <u>continue to rescue</u> victims from the ruins as the odds of survival begin to wane over a week since the Feb. 6 quake. <u>Many survivors are struggling</u> to find enough food, water and basic amenities.

UCC <u>Global H.O.P.E.</u> has launched the <u>Turkey and Syria Emergency Appeal</u> to direct financial support to partners responding in the areas of greatest need for relief and long-term recovery.

Assessing needs

"We continue to be in regular contact with partners in Turkey and Syria, who are active in the response," said Peter Makari, <u>Global Ministries</u> team leader for Middle East and Europe. This includes in Gaziantep, Turkey, where the UCC had a hand in establishing and offering a missionary presence at the Gaziantep Hospital. The Health and Education Foundation (SEV), the Turk-ish partner that runs the hospital, said that while the building has experienced only minor damage, Gaziantep is one of the ten cities that has been badly affected, and many in the area are experiencing shock and fear. The hospital will likely serve as a hub for medical treatment, said Makari.
