A Letter from Pastor John

Friends,

Ginny and I love to go to the beach. A few weeks ago, we made our last trip for the year to Warren Dunes, Michigan. As usual, we took note of the hundreds of hungry, winged beach beggars lounging on the sand or bobbing in the water. The wind had picked up that afternoon, and not many gulls were in flight. I noticed one gull flying near us, not making a lot of headway. Like his many relatives on the sand, it learned early in life to use the wind to great advantage by flying into it and managing to stay aloft. These birds, like all birds, adapt to changing weather conditions in order to fly in unfavorable conditions. In similar fashion, we human beings are capable of adapting to changing conditions, but at times there can be frequent frustrations or life-altering challenges that overtake us. Unlike our friends the gulls, we have not always learned how to ride the gusts and adapt to the winds of disappointment or despair.

There is a scripture verse meant for us that expresses hope for the times we need it the most when we are barely managing to stay aloft. "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint" (Isaiah 40:31). The soundness of these words is like an invocation, a summoning, to be hopeful in all things.

Duke Ellington had a sense for hope when he said, 'Gray skies are just clouds passing over." Another way to look at it is to believe that the sun shines every day even when we can't see it.

The following quote on the subject of eagles was given to me by a member of the congregation. May it serve as a respite for you this week.

"Did you know that an eagle knows when a storm is approaching long before it breaks? The eagle will fly to some high point and wait for the wind to come.

When the storm hits, the eagle sets its wings so that the wind will pick it up and lift it above the storm. While the storm rages below, the eagle soars above it.

The eagle does not escape from the storm. It simply uses the storm to lift it higher. It rises on the winds that bring the storm.

When the storms of life come upon us—and all of us will experience them—we can rise above them by setting our minds and our belief toward God. The storms do not have to overcome us. We can allow God's power to lift us above them.

God enables us to ride the winds of the storm that bring sickness, tragedy, failure, and disappointment in our lives. We can soar above the storm. Remember, it is not the burdens of life that weigh us down; it is how we handle them."
