#### A Letter from Pastor John

There are times when I am at home and comfortably seated in a straight back chair, and I imagine my monthly pastor's page for the church newsletter to be a poetic construct of theological and pastoral gravitas. That is until I am shaken back to reality by someone else's published work that so gently dominates the page of the writer's book. The poem below, though not pastoral, is appropriately occupied with life's questions, such a fitting composition of poise and ecological grace. Ginny and I attended a poetry reading recently held at an Episcopal church sanctuary in DeKalb. Nearly all of the local poets were there, all published, and they took turns reading their own superb poetry or the poetry of famous writers.

The Summer Day is one of the poems that touched me, especially the final line, posed as a question that came to me none-to-soon. The question could be a nudge for us, a wakeup call, even for us who are up there in years. The writer, Mary Oliver, was an American poet. She won a Pulitzer Prize in 1984, along with other awards over the years. Unfortunately, she passed away from cancer in 2019 at the age of 83, much too soon. A national newspaper described her as "far and away, this country's best-selling poet." So enjoy, and let me know what you think!

The Summer Day by Mary Oliver Who made the world? Who made the swan, and the black bear? Who made the grasshopper? This grasshopper, I mean the one who has flung herself out of the grass, the one who is eating sugar out of my hand, who is moving her jaws back and forth instead of up and down who is gazing around with her enormous and complicated eyes. Now she lifts her pale forearms and thoroughly washes her face. Now she snaps her wings open, and floats away. I don't know exactly what a prayer is. I do know how to pay attention, how to fall down into the grass, how to kneel down in the grass, how to be idle and blessed, how to stroll through the fields, which is what I have been doing all day. Tell me, what else should I have done? Doesn't everything die at last, and too soon? Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?


